Wadham School is a Church of England Community School in Crewkerne, south Somerset. It is an upper school, taking students from year 9 to year 13.

The Chaplaincy Project began in 2011 and has become well established and an instrumental part of Wadham School. The first chaplain was Rev Adrian Legg, followed by Tracey Hallett and the current chaplain is Cheryl Govier. Each chaplain has put their own identity on the role, using their gifts to shape how the role looks now.

Chaplaincy at Wadham has developed through working in partnership with the Diocese of Bath and Wells and Local Church Communities.
